### Preface

This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee CS-101, Sports and Recreational Equipment.

The objective of this document is to specify general safety requirements for the manufacture, installation, inspection and maintenance of permanently installed, freely accessible outdoor fitness equipment.

This document does not cover electrically driven equipment, functional training facilities (typically with unrestrained weights) nor military style obstacle courses.

This document is an adoption with national modifications, and has been reproduced from, EN 16630:2015, *Permanently installed outdoor fitness equipment* — *Safety requirements and test methods*. The modifications are additional requirements and are set out in <u>Appendix ZZ</u>, which has been added at the end of the source text.

<u>Appendix ZZ</u> lists the variations to EN 16630:2015 for the application of this Standard in Australia.

As this document has been reproduced from an International Standard, the following applies:

(a) In the source text "this European standard" should read "this document".

(b) A full point substitutes for a comma when referring to a decimal marker.
