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Preface

This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee CS-101, Sports and Recreational Equipment.

The objective of this document is to specify general safety requirements for the manufacture, installation, inspection and maintenance of permanently installed, freely accessible outdoor fitness equipment.

This document does not cover electrically driven equipment, functional training facilities (typically with unrestrained weights) nor military style obstacle courses.

This document is an adoption with national modifications, and has been reproduced from, EN 16630:2015, *Permanently installed outdoor fitness equipment — Safety requirements and test methods*. The modifications are additional requirements and are set out in [Appendix ZZ](#), which has been added at the end of the source text.
