National foreword

This standard has been prepared by CEN/TC 163 'Sanitary appliances' (Secretariat: Italy).

The preliminary work was done by Task Group 'Kitchen sinks' (WG3/TG1) of CEN/TC 163 (lead-managed by DIN).

The responsible German body involved in its preparation was the *Normenausschuss Wasserwesen* (Water Practice Standards Committee), Technical Committee V 18/UA 2 *Spültische – Ausgussbecken*.

Amendments

This standard differs from the October 1997 edition as follows:

a) The contents have been changed to reflect new trends on the marketplace and new technological developments, especially as regards the following:

- Account is made for waste outlets and overflows as in DIN EN 274-1.
- Dimension D_2 refers directly to reference diameter D_3 .
- Including dimension x ensures tool accessibility when attaching to taps.
- Including dimension d_3 ensures a more precise clearance for the tap pedestal.
- Dimensions are now given for fitting areas for two-hole mixer taps, thus reflecting the current popularity of such designs on the market.
- Dimensions S_1 and S_2 for the upper- and underside waste outlet hole-sealing surfaces, and dimension s_2 for the material thickness near the overflow hole have been introduced.
