National foreword

This standard has been prepared by CEN/TC 136.

The responsible German body involved in its preparation was the *Normenausschuß Sport- und Freizeitgerät* (Sports Equipment Standards Committee), Technical Committee *Tauch-Zubehör*.

Combined buoyancy and rescue devices as specified in this standard fall within the scope of the *Gerätesicherheitsgesetz*. Once compliance with the safety requirements specified therein has been verified by an accredited test house designated by the *Bundesminister für Arbeit und Sozialordnung* (German Federal Minister of Labour and Social Affairs), the device may be marked with the symbol GS (= *geprüfte Sicherheit*, safety tested).
